Esophageal Motility Study

Procedure: A tube will be inserted through your nose into your stomach. Measurements will be taken of the contraction and relaxation of the muscles in your esophagus as you swallow.

Preparation:

 Please have nothing to eat or drink for 6 hours prior to this procedure (except sips of water for <u>allowed</u> medications or a light snack 4 hours prior if necessary ie. diabetic)

IMPORTANT

For motility test only, please discontinue medications as follows:

Losec (Omeprazole)	Modulon (Trimebutine)	Motilium (Domperidone)
Pro Banthine	Prevacid (Lansoprozole)	Nexium (Esomeprazole)
Pariet (Rabeprazole)	Pantoloc (Pantoprazole)	Tecta (Pantoprazole magnesium)
Urecholine	Dexilant (dexlansoprazole)	Maxeran (Metoclopramide)

• If you are also having the 24 hour pH study please follow medication instructions for that test. (Failure to follow these instructions may result in your test being rescheduled)
